Superintendent's Corner

Save this June newsletter for summer dates and information

Idaho High School Activities Association (IHSAA) Rule 13

13-1 Students are required to undergo a physical examination and have it, along with an Interim Questionnaire, on file with the school prior to their first practice in any IHSAA sponsored sport, cheerleading, or dance activity. The Idaho Health Examination & Consent Form and Interim Questionnaire are available online at: idhsaa.org.

13-2 Physical exams must be taken and on file with the school prior to the first day of practice in the 9th and 11th grades. Any physical taken before May 1 of the 8th grade year will not be accepted.

13-3 Physicals are required in the 9th and 11th grade year. Students who have a physical in their 10th grade year must have another for the 11th grade. Students will not be required to take an additional physical examination during the 10th and 12th grades unless:

1. The physician recommends the student have an additional examination.
2. The parents request an examination in the Interim Questionnaire.
3. Affirmative answers on 1-9 of the Interim Questionnaire indicate a possible need for a repeat physical examination.
4. A student has transferred to Idaho from another state.

St. Mary's Clinic is providing sports physicals required by the IHSAA for a low cost of just \$25.00, St. Mary's also donates \$15.00 back to the school's athletic department. Students from all area schools are welcome, no reservations are necessary. Two dates are provided, see below:

Idaho Community Foundation Grant

Josette Nebeker, Ag Science & Tech Teacher, will receive \$1,762 from the State-wide Education Philanthropic Gift Fund, managed by the Idaho Community Foundation. This money will allow the purchase of a FABTotum Personal Fabricator with exchangeable heads that will allow 3-D printing, milling, and engraving that uses open source software for use by 90% of grades 9-12 student body.

St. Mary's Clinics Offer Sports Physicals

- St. Mary's Clinics bring you the 22nd annual Sports Physical Clinics for all area schools
- This program provides the necessary sports physical screening required by the Idaho High School Activities Association
- The cost of the exams are \$25 (payable at the time of the exam) with \$15 being donated back to the schools' athletic department

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- No appointment necessary
 - Students from any of the area schools are welcome to receive their physical at any one of the three clinics
 - Please wear shorts and a T-shirt or tank top to the exam. Also if you have prescription glasses or contacts please wear them for the physical
 - Immunization updates will be provided for no additional cost with consent
 - Students should bring their immunization records---as records will not be available during these sports physical clinics
 - If you did not get the Physical & Immunization forms from your school they may be picked up at one of the clinics in Cottonwood, Nezperce, Grangeville, Craigmont or Kamiah

Please note these physicals are only for the Jr. & Sr. High School students so they can fulfill the Idaho High School Athletic Association requirements.
